How We Help

Rixing Social Welfare Institution

Dalian Rixing Social Welfare Institution was established in 1997 and is solely private funded. Up to now, it has accepted almost 100 children. These children were either abandoned by their parents, or their parents were not able to care for them anymore. Due to the efforts and care of the Dalian Rixing Orphanage, the orphans are receiving an education. Some of them attend university, e.g. China Youth Politic College, Dalian University of Technology, Medical University. Others are in high school, (No. 8, No. 12, No. 21 and No. 80 high school); elementary school (Dalian Penghui Elementary school and Dalian Chunliu Elementary School) and the rest attends Kindergarten (Future Harvard Bilingual Kindergarten).

The Rixing Orphanage is managed through the principle of “Family Style Foster”. Other than some basic service positions, such as chef, dustman, teacher and accountant, there are “grandma”, “father” and “mother” who take care of them as family members. Those “parents” give the children love as if they were in a real home, and give them a chance to grow up in a warm family environment.

Proceeds from previous Winter Charity Balls have helped the orphanage to go further than providing an education and loving environment. They have arranged qualified mentors to provide courses on art and music. Some children can play several musical instruments, such as drum set, electronic organ, violin, etc. Charity funds also enabled a psychologist to visit the orphanage to offer counseling and improve the children’s mental health. Without this money, such additional expenses could never be covered.

Dalian Little Dolphin Recovery Centre

Little Dolphin Recovery Centre is a non-profit organisation dedicated to the rehabilitation training of children with autism in Dalian. The centre was established in May 2006 and covers an area of 1,400 square metres of institutions. At present, there are 56 autistic children in its programme and 18 professional teachers. Twelve years since it was founded, the centre has carried out effective intervention and rehabilitation training for more than 680 children with autism, most of who have improved in various abilities. The recovery centre has received much praise from parents and the community.

Proceeds from previous Winter Charity Balls has enabled this school to provide specialized training for their teachers and parents. Twice a year, the staff is sent to attend training courses in Beijing and Hong Kong, where they learn the most recent and successful ways to work with autistic kids. Additionally, professors have come from Beijing several times to make sure the staff is running the school in the most helpful and efficient way possible. This is the first time since the Recovery Centre’s founding in 2006 that this level of special instruction has been made available to autistic students in Dalian. It is truly making a difference.

Wang Da Jie Elderly Care Home

Wang Da Jie Elderly Care Home is a public-run non-profit organization, which has obtained the approval and archival filing by Jinzhou New Area Civil Affairs Bureau. It was founded by Ms. Wang Yi Ning in June 2006. Ms. Wang lost her parents at her age of 13 and turned as an orphan. With the unselfish help and support from her neighborhood, she grew up. Thus, at the beginning of her business success, she cared about the social charity. She established Wang Da Jie Elderly Care Home to support those homeless with no income elders, and treat them as her own parents.

By now, Wang Da Jie Elderly Care Home has supported over 300 people, including 160 elders, 47 orphans and disabled children who survived from Yushu Earthquake, 33 autistic children and their families, and is invested heavily in man power and financial resources. With her charity, Ms. Wang has received lots of the social recognitions and awards, including CCTV “Good Person By Your Side” in 2013.

However, in early 2014, Ms. Wang unfortunately suffered a serious car accident, and is still in the rehabilitation period currently. This unexpected misfortune has impacted the entire operation of Wang Da Jie Elderly Care Home. Let’s work together to help them through the tough time.

To relieve some of the pressure on the elderly home, the proceedings of previous Winter Charity Balls have been spent on buying daily necessities including vegetables, cooking oil, flour and rice. The charity funds also help to pay for the utility bills, buy heating equipment and the purchase and maintenance of other facilities.
